

What a year 2020 was. COVID threw the world into a tailspin and Hardwood Lake felt the effect. Activities and events were canceled. However, residents were able to get in some relaxation even with social distancing and other precautions. As Mother Nature prevailed, weeds continued to grow in the lake, treatment successfully continued and unimproved roads were brined and graded.

The Lake Improvement Board held a public meeting in July by meeting under social distancing guidelines. They approved a five year plan to continue treatment.

In addition to a few planned events like the boat parade, residents organized the first Halloween Trick-or-Treat gathering.

Lake treatment is scheduled to continue this year as usual. Paul Hausler from Progressive Engineering will make an early spring survey of the

lake to determine initial needs and order treatment. Then a followup inspection and periodic treatments as needed throughout the year.

Nothing has been determined as of this writing but generally there are algae treatments a few days before the three summer holidays.

The **Lake Association picnic** was canceled for 2020 due to the pandemic. It is scheduled for 5:00 pm Saturday, June 26, 2021 at the home of Fred & Grace Yeihey, 3047 S. Henderson Lake Rd. This is subject to change depending on State pandemic regulations. The association will provide smoked pulled pork and chicken quarters by award winning chef and lake resident Dan Joseph. Bottled water, plates and utensils will be provided.

Please bring a dish to pass and a chair.

Another 100' **algae boom** was authorized and purchased. It will be added to the existing boom at the east end swamp inlet. The first one had a positive impact in limiting algae flow into the lake so a second boom should help further.

Last Fall there was a push by a couple residents to have natural gas brought in. DTE Energy was the vendor and said they needed at least 46 customers to make it a viable project. A survey was conducted along Henderson Lake


Road and Hardwood Heights with limited positive response. Per DTE: "Our lead Sales Associate that works with homeowners on making the switch to natural gas has

completed his review of your project. He determined that there are only 23 residences with a high probability to sign-up for natural gas. He noted that high seasonality and average home

sizes were the reasons he didn't believe he would be able to sign-up 46 residents the first year. Given his review and the lack of positive responses to the survey at the price of \$3,420 lump sum or on their monthly gas bill for \$43.79/month DTE will not be pursuing this project in 2021."

New **hydrological maps** of the lake were created, the first update in about 75 years, and are posted on the web at: <http://www.hardwoodlake.org/newhydromaps.html>

Depth measurements in those early days were often conducted during the winter months. Holes were drilled through the ice and water depths were measured with weighted drop lines. Aerial photography was used to map the shoreline. It was not uncommon for field crews to spend several days on a lake drilling holes and taking meticulous measurements of water depths and bottom substrate.



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Upcoming events

The annual Hardwood Lake Property Owners Association meeting is scheduled for 9:00 am Saturday, July 3 at the Logan Township Hall on M-55. On the agenda will be a review of the lake cleanup and election of the President and all four directors.

The July 4 boat parade is proving to be a popular event and is planned again for 2:00 p.m.

Tentatively scheduled for 7:00 p.m. Saturday, August 21 is Ice Cream night on the lake. Enjoy some ice cream sponsored by the Lake Association and have a chance to visit at the sandbar, by the boat launch, while out on the lake.




